CASUAL FITNESS STUDIO ATTENDANT COMOX COMMUNITY CENTRE

The Town of Comox invites applications for the position of **Casual Fitness Studio Attendant** at the Comox Community Centre. This is a casual, on-call Union position (CUPE Local 556) with a current rate of pay of \$26.37 per hour plus 12.8% in lieu of vacation and benefits. The successful applicant will be required for vacation replacement, sick leave and extra shifts, and may be required to work evenings and weekends.

Reporting to the Recreation Director, the Fitness Studio Attendant is responsible for designated operations of the fitness studio, including the safety and control of the fitness studio and its patrons. This casual position maintains a welcoming environment and instructs customers on the proper use of equipment.

Typical Duties & Responsibilities include:

- Ensuring customers are adhering to the Fitness Studio's code of conduct;
- Setting up, monitoring, and cleaning equipment;
- Assisting in promoting recreation programs;
- Carrying out safe work practices; and,
- Supporting and promoting excellent customer service.

Required Knowledge & Skills:

- Completion of Grade 12;
- BCRPA, CanFitPro or equivalent Personal Training Certification;
- Minimum of 2 years Fitness Studio/Weight Room supervision;
- Valid First Aid certification (Emergency First Aid CPR-C and AED, or greater);
- Strong interpersonal, communication, and problem-solving skills; and,
- Current clean criminal record check.
