PERMANENT PART-TIME CHILD CARE WORKER COMOX COMMUNITY CENTRE

The Town of Comox invites applications for the part-time (12.5 hours per week) Child Care Worker position at the Comox Community Centre. This is a regular, part-time union position subject to the terms and conditions in the collective agreement between the Town of Comox and CUPE Local 556. The current rate of pay is \$23.44 per hour and includes a three-month probationary period.

Hours of work are currently scheduled as Monday through Friday, 8:30 am to 11:00 am. This position involves working with children and providing a safe environment of care. If you are inspired by children and families, and passionate about providing quality care, come join the team at the Comox Community Centre!

Typical Duties & Responsibilities include:

- Overseeing the overall operations of the Childminding Program;
- Daily set-up and take-down of equipment;
- Supervising and implementing daily activities;
- Ensuring a safe and appropriate program for all children;
- Providing reports as required; and,
- Communicating with parents/guardians.

Required Knowledge & Skills:

- Completion of Grade 12;
- ECE certification or ECE assistant certification preferred;
- Minimum of two years of experience working with children in a recreational or childcare based setting;
- Emergency First Aid (Basic) certification;
- Infant/child CPR and AED certification;
- Ability to carry out instructions in written and/or verbal form; and,
- Current clean criminal record check.
